I am pleased to report COVID-19 cases have been relatively low at school over the last week. However, cases have risen sharply in the Marlow area, and it is crucial we continue to proceed with caution especially with there now being a new variant. As always, I will continue to follow the guidance provided to me by Public Health and I assure you no decision relating to COVID-19 measures is taken lightly. Please continue to keep your children at home if they have any symptoms of COVID-19 and book a PCR test at the earliest opportunity. Your child

can then return to school once a negative test result has been received.

With cases rising and some other local schools moving bubbles to remote learning, I have reviewed our remote learning offering with the staff. Accompanying this newsletter is the updated Frieth Remote Learning Policy containing what you can expect if your child is isolating; a bubble is isolating or the whole school has moved to remote learning.



This year, we will be allowing children to bring in Christmas cards which we will then 'quarantine' before they are distributed. Therefore, I would ask that

all cards are brought in by Friday morning (10<sup>th</sup> December) so that they can be quarantined over the weekend and then handed out next week.



As long as guidance allows next term we will be introducing class assemblies. Parents will be welcomed in to watch their children's performance and then invited back to classroom so that children can share their work with them. Please find the tentative dates for these assemblies at the bottom of this newsletter.

I would also like to take this opportunity to politely request that parents book appointments for their children outside school hours. I realise that sometimes it is unavoidable however there seems to have been a sharp rise in appointments recently. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

You may have noticed our Junior Road Safety Officers, who have been doing a fantastic job keeping everybody safe each morning. Please find below some requests and advice they would like to share with you.



'We are the JRSO's and hopefully you have seen us wearing hi-vis

jackets and a cap, standing outside the front the school in the mornings.

Please try to walk to school at least once a week. You can park on the hill and walk up. If you walk to school once a week, park and stride or come by bus or car share, you will get a badge at the end of the month.

If you have to use the turning circle in the morning to drop off your child, please do not get out of the car. If your child needs help getting out of the car, then you need to park away from the school and walk your child to the front gate. We will be issuing tickets if we see people incorrectly using the turning circle.
