Online Activities

There are 5 multiple choice questions that can be completed using our readymade 2DIY activity. These can be completed individually by the children using iPads, computers or laptops or can be completed as a group on the whiteboard, like a quiz show. In the writing activity at the end of the chapter, the children write a review about the story.
