Celebrating Diversity and Preparing for Life in Modern Britain

Thank you for the positive feedback shared during Parents' Evening on the questionnaires. It's clear that our families value the work we do to prepare children for life in modern Britain, and to celebrate the many different cultures, backgrounds, and beliefs that make our world so special.

As you may know, at Frieth our curriculum is carefully designed to help pupils fill gaps in their knowledge while developing an understanding and appreciation of a wide range of cultures and faiths. Each year group explores rich and meaningful texts that tell stories from around the world, reflecting the diversity of our global community. Every year group also visits a major place of worship, so that by the time our pupils leave Frieth, they will have experienced and learned about all the world's main religions. We also place a strong emphasis on high-quality PSHE lessons, helping children to respect differences, value others' points of view, and celebrate what makes each of us unique.

This year, we are especially excited to be expanding this work through The Schools Linking Programme. We'll be partnering with Oakridge Academy Primary School, a local school based in High Wycombe. This project will give all pupils taking part a wonderful

opportunity to connect and build relationships with children from different backgrounds and neighbourhoods. Together, they will explore similarities and differences, build friendships, and celebrate diversity in all its forms.

We can't wait to share updates and highlights from this exciting partnership throughout the year!
