There have been a number of children coming into school with items which are not school uniform recently. To clarify the policy, if girls are wearing an alice band, it needs to be small, plain and preferably in school colours and long hair should always be tied back. The only jewellery permitted are small silver or gold stud earings. Nail varnish is not permitted. We also have an issue of overcrowding in the cloakrooms. Pupils need a bag large enough for their book and a small pencil case, such as a book bag, and a PE bag. Arrival and Collection from School

The beginning of the new academic year is a good time to remind all parents of the safety rules we currently have in place.

- Please abide by our school opening times and drop your children off between 8:45 and 8:55. A member of staff will be on the front gate to greet the arrivals and keep an eye on the turning circle in the morning and Mrs Ansell will be on duty to look after the pupils on the back playground until the whistle blows at 8:55. Initially reception age pupils may go straight to Owls class with their parents for the 10 minute settling in period until they are happy to be left in the playground.
- Please do not get out of your car in the drop off zone. If you need to pop into the office, or your child is unable to let themselves out of the car, please park further away and walk in with your child.
- Please do not park in the car park after 3pm

Please only park in designated parking spaces, as parking in the entrance way to the village hall and the car park limits the space, blocks the emergency access to the school and is hazardous for the pupils walking past.
