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Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools

As you are aware we had our SIAMs inspection this week. Thank you to all the parents who completed the questionnaire or gave up some time to talk to the inspector, the staff who went above and beyond to ensure the school looked wonderful and demonstrated why it is a privilege to work with them, and mostly to the pupils, who were brilliant in their learning, their behaviour and their welcome! We had a lovely day and Mrs Walley asked me especially to say thank you for the very warm welcome she received. We look forward to sharing the outcomes of the inspection as soon as the final report is published.

The Quest KS2 project homework

It has been brought to my attention that a number of parents are unaware of how the pupils received feedback on their homework project last term and how their fantastic projects were celebrated in school. We are always extremely proud of the creative project work the pupils do at home and appreciative of the time and effort parents put into supporting this and so I would like to clarify the feedback and the praise the children were given on their fantastic projects at the end of last term.

On Monday 21st March we timetabled the entire morning for the KS2 pupils to play their games with each other in the hall. All the pupils had a peer assessment feedback sheet with their game, and each group who came to play the game left feedback on the sheet. These, alongside a photo of the child and their game have been kept by the teachers as a record of their project with their topic work. In addition the teachers gave verbal feedback to the children in school as part of their learning and kept the games on display all week when they were not being played with by the pupils. There were also other opportunities during the remainder of the week for the children to play their games together before they were sent home. All the KS2 pupils were praised for their efforts in the assembly the following morning and in the last week of term I put a page on the website with photos and a short piece of information about the morning and how marvellous the projects were.

We purposefully decided that the most valuable experience and appropriate feedback for a games project was for the children to actually play and enjoy them together and to help peer assess and give feedback to each other. I hope this clarifies for all our parents how proud we are of the project work that the children brought in.
